Fourteen Years and still standing!

The fourteen year journey we've been on since December 1996 to raise £5m. redevelop the old Highfields Youth and Community Centre and to bring it all under community governance has been a costly exercise, not just in terms of the legal and associated fees but especially in terms of the time, energy and creative talents that have had to be utilised to overcome the numerous and seemingly never ending obstacles we've had to surmount. The Council's decision in 2004 to inflict the wretched and disastrous lifelong learning review on this Centre gave rise to a much more vigorous and determined campaign (HUC) by us to get things back on track. This was achieved in December 2006 but it took another two years before the decision to complete the transfer was made in January 2009 and yet, the agony continued!

Action and not just warm words, thank you Andy Keeling!

By our last AGM, it was clear that this situation could not be tolerated for much longer and hence, on 4th March 2010, a public meeting was held to consider the reasons why senior Council officers were being allowed to sabotage the democratic decisions of the Council's Cabinet. With the new political leadership within the Council, a further Cabinet decision was effected on 21st June 2010 to complete the long delayed transfer by 1st August 2010. Whilst this was fairly ambitious, as there were still many of the details still to be finalised, the fact that we've finally Users completed the transfer is in many ways due to the very first senior Council officer since local government reorganisation in 1997 who has maintained a consistently open, honest and a refreshingly welcome integrity in his dealings with us. For that, a big thank you to Andy Keeling, the Council's Deputy Chief Executive. But, as he has been the first to point out, he was doing nothing more than what was required of him

in relation to the decisions made by the ruling

A first step on this road will be the Independence Celebration event and official opening of Highfields Centre on 27th January 2011 and we look forward to seeing you on that day, if not before.
